What to be aware of

- The AFDRS is a **generational change** in the way that fire danger is calculated and communicated.
- Although the Fire Danger Ratings and Fire Behaviour Index may look superficially like the McArthur-based system, beneath the surface the logic, assumptions and **calculations are very different**.
- It is important that you understand how the calculation of fire danger has changed, and which fire behaviour models and fuel types have been used, and what **assumptions and limitations apply** to them.
- The AFDRS brings with it a range of **useful products** that support operational decision-making. For example, the FBI Quick Guides, Fire Danger Viewer, new BoM products and new climate outlook products.
